

Going for Gold Times Tables Booklet

This booklet is a great way to help motivate your child to learn their times tables, and it helps them to see what they have achieved as they achieve the awards.

How to Use This Booklet

Within this booklet, you will find all of the times tables up to 12×12 . Select one to focus on at a time – it's best to start with the easier ones such as $1\times$, $2\times$, $5\times$ and $10\times$, as these will help boost your child's confidence as they achieve some gold awards. Practise using any method your child prefers (see A Grown Up's Guide to Times Tables for further ideas). Once your child is ready, you can then test them to see if they can achieve their bronze, silver and gold award for that times table. If they achieve gold, you could give them a small reward for great work.

A Guide to the Awards

Bronze: Your child can say the times table from memory in the correct order without any mistakes.

Silver: Your child can answer mixed questions from that times table column such as $3 \times 5 = 15$ or $7 \times 5 = 35$.

Gold: Your child knows the inverse fact for each multiplication (such as $35 \div 5 = 7$) and can answer them quickly from memory, in any order.
